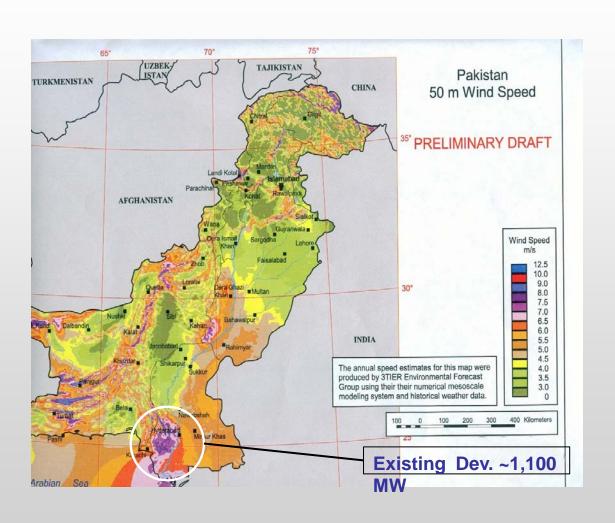
Pakistan Wind Development Status

What can be done to accelerate wind development?

New developments in terms of policy, tariff and other enablers

- Power purchaser concerns
- Work with provincial governments to clarify land use and acquisition policies for wind projects
- Streamline tariff process pre CoD and post (including the appeal process)
- Allow for Rs/RMB-Euro exchange rate indexation for loans and O&M
- Develop policy, regulatory framework, documentation, and infrastructure for offshore wind power
- Streamline GoPak consents (SECP director's approval, share transfer, companies incorporation with Foreign Investment)

- Upfront tariff of ~14 cents/kwh announced; but needs work on the documentation
- Wind risk (7.3 7.4 m/s) taken away, however projects enjoy the upside
- Pre-CoD payments allowed (RoE and O&M) thereby incentivizing sectional completion
- All CERs go to Wind IPPs (rather than 50% share presently)
